

NEISSERIA MENINGITIDIS



Neisseria meningitidis is a coccus shaped bacterium that exists in pairs and can cause bacterial meningitis. Meningitis is an inflammation of the membranes surrounding the brain and spinal cord. Fever, headache, and a stiff neck are the most common symptoms of the infection. N. meningitidis can also cause an infection of the blood, known as meningococcemia.
